Students receiving three or more "NOs" on the checklist will not be permitted to exhibit a livestock project through Midway FFA the following year. Students receiving two or fewer "NOs" will be eligible to exhibit a project at MCJLS the following year. Students receiving one or fewer "NOs" will be eligible to exhibit a project at the major level the following year.

\*\*In addition to the Livestock Eligibility checklist, according to the Ag Facility rules and contract: A written strike system will be implemented. If students and parents do not comply with the rules listed in this document (i.e. completing barn duty/cleaning schedule), upon receiving their third written ASIF strike, the student will have to remove their animal within 24 hours.
